# RESOLUTION

Providing Capitol-flown flags for recipients of the Medal of  
Honor.

1       *Resolved,*

2       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

3           This resolution may be cited as the “Staff Sergeant  
4 Salvatore A. Giunta Medal of Honor Flag Resolution”.

5       **SEC. 2. PROVIDING CAPITOL-FLOWN FLAGS FOR RECIPI-**  
6                               **ENTS OF MEDAL OF HONOR.**

7           (a) IN GENERAL.—At the request of a recipient of  
8 the Medal of Honor or an immediate family member of  
9 a recipient of the Medal of Honor, the Representative of

1 the recipient or the Representative of the family member  
2 (as the case may be) may provide the recipient or the fam-  
3 ily member with a Capitol-flown flag, together with the  
4 certificate described in subsection (c), except that not  
5 more than one flag may be provided under this resolution  
6 with respect to the Medal of Honor recipient involved.

7 (b) NO COST TO FAMILY.—A flag provided under  
8 this section shall be provided at no cost to the individual  
9 receiving the flag.

10 (c) CERTIFICATE DESCRIBED.—The certificate de-  
11 scribed in this subsection is a certificate which is signed  
12 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the  
13 Representative providing the flag, and which reads as fol-  
14 lows: “This flag has been flown over the United States  
15 Capitol, in honor of the service and sacrifice of recipients  
16 of the Medal of Honor, the highest honor awarded to  
17 members of the Armed Forces for valor in combat, with  
18 profound gratitude on behalf of the United States House  
19 of Representatives.”.

20 (d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—

21 (1) the term “Capitol-flown flag” means a  
22 United States flag flown over the United States  
23 Capitol in honor of the Medal of Honor recipient in-  
24 volved; and

1           (2) the term “Representative” includes a Dele-  
2           gate or Resident Commissioner to the Congress.

3 **SEC. 3. REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURES.**

4           (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 30 days after the  
5           date of the date of the adoption of this resolution, the  
6           Clerk of the House of Representatives shall issue regula-  
7           tions for carrying out this resolution, including regulations  
8           to establish procedures (including any appropriate forms,  
9           guidelines, and accompanying certificates) for requesting  
10          a Capitol-flown flag.

11          (b) APPROVAL BY COMMITTEE ON HOUSE ADMINIS-  
12          TRATION.—The regulations issued by the Clerk under sub-  
13          section (a) shall take effect upon approval by the Com-  
14          mittee on House Administration of the House of Rep-  
15          resentatives.
