Mr. WEBSTER, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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**RESOLUTION**

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2216) making appropriations for military construction, the Department of Veterans Affairs, and related agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2014, and for other purposes; and providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2217) making appropriations for the Department of Homeland Security for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2014, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of  
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 2216) making appropriations for  
6 military construction, the Department of Veterans Affairs,  
7 and related agencies for the fiscal year ending September  
8 30, 2014, and for other purposes. The first reading of the  
9 bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order against  
10 consideration of the bill are waived. General debate shall  
11 be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equal-  
12 ly divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minor-  
13 ity member of the Committee on Appropriations. After  
14 general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment  
15 under the five-minute rule. Points of order against provi-  
16 sions in the bill for failure to comply with clause 2 of rule  
17 XXI are waived. During consideration of the bill for  
18 amendment, the chair of the Committee of the Whole may  
19 accord priority in recognition on the basis of whether the  
20 Member offering an amendment has caused it to be print-  
21 ed in the portion of the Congressional Record designated  
22 for that purpose in clause 8 of rule XVIII. Amendments  
23 so printed shall be considered as read. When the com-  
24 mittee rises and reports the bill back to the House with  
25 a recommendation that the bill do pass, the previous ques-

1 tion shall be considered as ordered on the bill and amend-  
2 ments thereto to final passage without intervening motion  
3 except one motion to recommit with or without instruc-  
4 tions.

5       SEC. 2. At any time after the adoption of this resolu-  
6 tion the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule  
7 XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee of  
8 the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
9 ation of the bill (H.R. 2217) making appropriations for  
10 the Department of Homeland Security for the fiscal year  
11 ending September 30, 2014, and for other purposes. The  
12 first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points  
13 of order against consideration of the bill are waived. Gen-  
14 eral debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not ex-  
15 ceed one hour equally divided and controlled by the chair  
16 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Appro-  
17 priations. After general debate the bill shall be considered  
18 for amendment under the five-minute rule. Points of order  
19 against provisions in the bill for failure to comply with  
20 clause 2 of rule XXI are waived except for section 563.  
21 During consideration of the bill for amendment, the chair  
22 of the Committee of the Whole may accord priority in rec-  
23 ognition on the basis of whether the Member offering an  
24 amendment has caused it to be printed in the portion of  
25 the Congressional Record designated for that purpose in

1 clause 8 of rule XVIII. Amendments so printed shall be  
2 considered as read. When the committee rises and reports  
3 the bill back to the House with a recommendation that  
4 the bill do pass, the previous question shall be considered  
5 as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to final  
6 passage without intervening motion except one motion to  
7 recommit with or without instructions.

8       SEC. 3. Pending the adoption of a concurrent resolu-  
9 tion on the budget for fiscal year 2014, the provisions of  
10 House Concurrent Resolution 25, as adopted by the  
11 House, shall have force and effect in the House as though  
12 Congress has adopted such concurrent resolution, and the  
13 allocations of spending authority printed in Tables 11 and  
14 12 of House Report 113-17 shall be considered for all pur-  
15 poses in the House to be the allocations under section  
16 302(a) of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974.
