

funds are eligible for, and requires state, tribal, or local law enforcement agencies and prosecuting offices that receive funding under the program to report to the Attorney General information regarding the use of the grants. It also requires the NIJ to conduct bi-annual evaluation of the practices deployed by the grant recipients to identify best practices for improving clearance rates for homicides, rapes, sexual assaults, kidnappings, and non-fatal shootings and submit any findings to Congress. This section Authorizes \$100,000,000 each year from fiscal year 2023 through fiscal year 2032, setting aside 10 percent of each appropriation for Tribal offices or agencies.
