Resolution Funding National Defense, Extending Children's Health Insurance Program, and Continuing Government Operations

House Amendment to Senate Amendment to H.R. 1370

Maintains Federal Operations and Prevents a Government Shutdown

- Continues funding at the current (FY 2017) rate until January 19, 2018
- Without this measure, existing funding would run out on December 22
- Clean extension of funding with limited changes to ensure good governance
- Extends the National Flood Insurance Program through January 19, 2018
- Waives automatic cuts to defense funding for FY 2018 and temporarily delays the January automatic cuts to non-defense funding caused by sequestration

Fully Funds National Defense Programs for FY 2018

- Includes Department of Defense funding legislation passed twice by the House
- Prioritizes strong national security by boosting base funding for the Department of Defense by **\$68.1 billion** above FY 2017 levels
- Ensures our troops have the resources they need to be ready to fight now and to advance peace and our nation's interests abroad
- Totals **\$663.8 billion** in base, Overseas Contingency Operations, and emergency funding for the Department of Defense

Provides Emergency and Overseas Contingency Operations Military Funding to Bolster Our Missile Defense

• Contains an additional **\$5.9 billion** in emergency and Overseas Contingency Operations funding *as requested by the Trump Administration* to bolster missile defense, replace damaged ships, and provide resources for the surge in troops

Continues Funding for the Children's Health Insurance Program

- Includes the full, House-passed CHAMPIONING HEALTHY KIDS bill (H.R. 3922)
- Extends funding for Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), Federally Qualified Health Centers, and other important health programs
- Ensures 9 million children from low-income families receive important health coverage through the CHIP program

Includes Critical Funding for the VA Choice Program

• Provides **\$2.1 billion** in mandatory funding to ensure veterans continue to receive health care they need and deserve
