# RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the Senate amendment to the bill (H.R. 34) to authorize and strengthen the tsunami detection, forecast, warning, research, and mitigation program of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, and for other purposes, and providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 6392) to amend the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act to specify when bank holding companies may be subject to certain enhanced supervision, and for other purposes.

1        *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it  
2 shall be in order to take from the Speaker's table the bill  
3 (H.R. 34) to authorize and strengthen the tsunami detec-  
4 tion, forecast, warning, research, and mitigation program  
5 of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration,  
6 and for other purposes, with the Senate amendment there-  
7 to, and to consider in the House, without intervention of  
8 any point of order, a motion offered by the chair of the  
9 Committee on Energy and Commerce or his designee that  
10 the House concur in the Senate amendment with an  
11 amendment consisting of the text of Rules Committee  
12 Print 114-67 modified by the amendment printed in part  
13 A of the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying  
14 this resolution. The Senate amendment and the motion  
15 shall be considered as read. The motion shall be debatable  
16 for 80 minutes, with 60 minutes equally divided and con-  
17 trolled by the chair and ranking minority member of the  
18 Committee on Energy and Commerce and 20 minutes  
19 equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking  
20 minority member of the Committee on Ways and Means.  
21 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on  
22 the motion to its adoption without intervening motion.

23        SEC. 2. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
24 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 6392)  
25 to amend the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Con-

1     sumer Protection Act to specify when bank holding compa-  
2     nies may be subject to certain enhanced supervision, and  
3     for other purposes. All points of order against consider-  
4     ation of the bill are waived. The bill shall be considered  
5     as read. All points of order against provisions in the bill  
6     are waived. The previous question shall be considered as  
7     ordered on the bill and on any amendment thereto to final  
8     passage without intervening motion except: (1) one hour  
9     of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and  
10     ranking minority member of the Committee on Financial  
11     Services; (2) the amendment printed in part B of the re-  
12     port of the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolu-  
13     tion, if offered by the Member designated in the report,  
14     which shall be in order without intervention of any point  
15     of order, shall be considered as read, shall be separately  
16     debatable for the time specified in the report equally di-  
17     vided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent,  
18     and shall not be subject to a demand for a division of the  
19     question; and (3) one motion to recommit with or without  
20     instructions.
