## RESOLUTION

- Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2936) to expedite under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 and improve forest management activities on National Forest System lands, on public lands under the jurisdiction of the Bureau of Land Management, and on Tribal lands to return resilience to overgrown, fireprone forested lands, and for other purposes.
  - 1 *Resolved*, That at any time after adoption of this reso-
  - 2 lution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule

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1 XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee of 2 the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-3 ation of the bill (H.R. 2936) to expedite under the Na-4 tional Environmental Policy Act of 1969 and improve for-5 est management activities on National Forest System lands, on public lands under the jurisdiction of the Bureau 6 of Land Management, and on Tribal lands to return resil-7 8 ience to overgrown, fire-prone forested lands, and for other 9 purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed 10 with. All points of order against consideration of the bill are waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill 11 12 and amendments specified in this resolution and shall not 13 exceed one hour equally divided among and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee 14 15 on Agriculture and the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on Natural Resources. After general 16 debate the bill shall be considered for amendment under 17 the five-minute rule. In lieu of the amendments in the na-18 ture of a substitute recommended by the Committees on 19 20 Agriculture and Natural Resources now printed in the bill, 21 it shall be in order to consider as an original bill for the 22 purpose of amendment under the five-minute rule an 23 amendment in the nature of a substitute consisting of the 24 text of Rules Committee Print 115-36. That amendment 25 in the nature of a substitute shall be considered as read.

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All points of order against that amendment in the nature 1 2 of a substitute are waived. No amendment to that amend-3 ment in the nature of a substitute shall be in order except 4 those printed in the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution. Each such amendment may 5 be offered only in the order printed in the report, may 6 7 be offered only by a Member designated in the report, 8 shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time 9 specified in the report equally divided and controlled by 10 the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand for divi-11 12 sion of the question in the House or in the Committee of the Whole. All points of order against such amendments 13 are waived. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill 14 15 for amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House with such amendments as may have been 16 adopted. Any Member may demand a separate vote in the 17 House on any amendment adopted in the Committee of 18 the Whole to the bill or to the amendment in the nature 19 of a substitute made in order as original text. The previous 20 21 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and 22 amendments thereto to final passage without intervening 23 motion except one motion to recommit with or without instructions. 24
