The Senate amendments 13 14 and the motion shall be considered as read. The motion 15 shall be debatable for one hour equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the 16 Committee on Appropriations. The previous question shall 17 18 be considered as ordered on the motion to adoption with-19 out intervening motion or demand for division of the ques-20 tion.
