# A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to clarify the definition of "crime of violence", and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Community Safety and

5 Security Act of 2018".

### 6 SEC. 2. CRIME OF VIOLENCE.

7 Section 16 of title 18, United States Code, is amend-8 ed to read as follows:

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#### 1 "SEC. 16. CRIME OF VIOLENCE DEFINED.

2 "(a) The term 'crime of violence' means an offense

"(1)(A) that—

5 "(i) is murder, voluntary manslaughter, as-6 sault, sexual abuse or aggravated sexual abuse, 7 abusive sexual contact, child abuse, kidnapping, 8 robbery, carjacking, firearms use, burglary, 9 arson, extortion, communication of threats, co-10 ercion, fleeing, interference with flight crew 11 members and attendants, domestic violence, 12 hostage taking, stalking, human trafficking, pi-13 racy, or a terrorism offense as described in 14 chapter 113B (other than in section 2332d); or 15 "(ii) involves the unlawful possession or 16 use of a weapon of mass destruction; or 17 "(B) that involves use or unlawful posses-18 sion of explosives or destructive devices de-19 scribed in 5845(f) of the Internal Revenue Code 20of 1986;

21 "(2) that has as an element the use, attempted
22 use, or threatened use of physical force against the
23 person or property of another; or

24 "(3) that is an attempt to commit, conspiracy25 to commit, solicitation to commit, or aiding and

1	abetting any of the offenses set forth in paragraphs
2	(1)  and  (2).

3 "(b) In this section:

"(1) The term 'abusive sexual contact' means 4 5 conduct described in section 2244(a)(1) and (a)(2). "(2) The terms 'aggravated sexual abuse' and 6 7 'sexual abuse' mean conduct described in sections 8 2241 and 2242. For purposes of such conduct, the 9 term 'sexual act' means conduct described in section 10 2246(2), or the knowing and lewd exposure of geni-11 talia or masturbation, to any person, with an intent 12 to abuse, humiliate, harass, degrade, or arouse or 13 gratify the sexual desire of any person.

14. "(3) The term 'assault' means conduct de15 scribed in section 113(a), and includes conduct com16 mitted recklessly, knowingly, or intentionally.

"(4) The term 'arson' means conduct described
in section 844(i) or unlawfully or willfully damaging
or destroying any building, inhabited structure, vehicle, vessel, or real property by means of fire or explosive.

"(5) The term 'burglary' means an unlawful or
unprivileged entry into, or remaining in, a building
or structure, including any nonpermanent or mobile
structure that is adapted or used for overnight ac-

commodation or for the ordinary carrying on of busi ness, and, either before or after entering, the per son—
 "(A) forms the intent to commit a crime;
 or

6 "(B) commits or attempts to commit a 7 crime.

8 "(6) The term 'carjacking' means conduct de-9 scribed in section 2119, or the unlawful taking of a 10 motor vehicle from the immediate actual possession 11 of a person against his will, by means of actual or 12 threatened force, or violence or intimidation, or by 13 sudden or stealthy seizure or snatching, or fear of 14 injury.

15 "(7) The term 'child abuse' means the unlawful
16 infliction of physical injury or the commission of any
17 sexual act against a child under fourteen by any per18 son eighteen years of age or older.

19 "(8) The term 'communication of threats'
20 means conduct described in section 844(e), or the
21 transmission of any communications containing any
22 threat of use of violence to—

23 "(A) demand or request for a ransom or
24 reward for the release of any kidnapped person;
25 or

1 "(B) threaten to kidnap or injure the per-2 son of another.

3 "(9) The term 'coercion' means causing the performance or non-performance of any act by an-4 5 other person under which such other person has a 6 legal right to do or to abstain from doing, through 7 fraud or by the use of actual or threatened force, vi-8 olence, or fear thereof, including the use, or an ex-9 press or implicit threat of use, of violence to cause 10 harm, or threats to cause injury to the person, rep-11 utation or property of any person.

"(10) The term 'domestic violence' means any 12 13 assault committed by a current or former spouse, 14 parent, or guardian of the victim, by a person with 15 whom the victim shares a child in common, by a per-16 son who is cohabiting with or has cohabited with the victim as a spouse, parent, or guardian, or by a per-17 18 son similarly situated to a spouse, parent, or guard-19 ian of the victim.

"(11) The term 'extortion' means conduct described in section 1951(b)(2)), but not extortion
under color of official right or fear of economic loss.
"(12) The term 'firearms use' means conduct
described in section 924(c) or 929(a), if the firearm
was brandished, discharged, or otherwise possessed,

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1 carried, or used as a weapon and the crime of vio-2 lence or drug trafficking crime during and in rela-3 tion to which the firearm was possessed, carried, or used was subject to prosecution in any court of the 4 5 United States, State court, military court or tri-6 bunal, or tribal court. Such term also includes un-7 lawfully possessing a firearm described in section 8 5845(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (such 9 as a sawed-off shotgun or sawed-off rifle, silencer, 10 bomb, or machine gun), possession of a firearm in 11 violation of section 922(g)(1),922(g)(2)and 12 922(g)(4), possession of a firearm with the intent to 13 use such firearm unlawfully, or reckless discharge of 14 a firearm at a dwelling.

15 "(13) The term 'fleeing' means knowingly oper16 ating a motor vehicle and, following a law enforce17 ment officer's signal to bring the motor vehicle to a
18 stop—

19 "(A) failing or refusing to comply; or
20 "(B) fleeing or attempting to elude a law
21 enforcement officer.

22 "(14) The term 'force' means the level of force
23 capable of causing physical pain or injury or needed
24 or intended to overcome resistance.

"(15) The term 'hostage taking' means conduct
 described in section 1203.

3 "(16) The term 'human trafficking' means con4 duct described in section 1589, 1590, and 1591.

5 "(17) The term 'interference with flight crew
6 members and attendants' means conduct described
7 in section 46504 of title 49, United States Code.

8 "(18) The term 'kidnapping' means conduct de-9 scribed in section 1201(a)(1) or seizing, confining, 10 inveigling, decoying, abducting, or carrying away 11 and holding for ransom or reward or otherwise any 12 person.

13 "(19) The term 'murder' means conduct de14 scribed as murder in the first degree or murder in
15 the second degree described in section 1111.

16 "(20) the term 'robbery' means conduct de-17 scribed in section 1951(b)(1), or the unlawful taking 18 or obtaining of personal property from the person or 19 in the presence of another, against his will, by 20 means of actual or threatened force, or violence or 21 intimidation, or by sudden or stealthy seizure or 22 snatching, or fear of injury, immediate or future, to 23 his person or property, or property in his custody or 24 possession, or the person or property of a relative or

member of his family or of anyone in his company
 at the time of the taking or obtaining.

3 "(21) The term 'stalking' means conduct de4 scribed in section 2261A.

5 "(22) The term 'weapon of mass destruction'
6 has the meaning given such term in section
7 2332a(c).

8 "(23) the term 'voluntary manslaughter' means
9 conduct described in section 1112(a).

10 "(c) For purposes of this section, in the case of any 11 reference in subsection (b) to an offense under this title, 12 such reference shall include conduct that constitutes an 13 offense under State or tribal law or under the Uniform 14 Code of Military Justice, if such conduct would be an of-15 fense under this title if a circumstance giving rise to Fed-16 eral jurisdiction had existed.

17 "(d) For purposes of this section, the term 'con-18 spiracy' includes any offense that is a conspiracy to com-19 mit another offense under State or Federal law, irrespec-20 tive of whether proof of an overt act is required to estab-21 lish commission of the conspiracy offense.".
