The amendment in the nature of a substitute rec-6 ommended by the Committee on the Judiciary now printed 8 in the bill shall be considered as adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. All points of order 10 against provisions in the bill, as amended, are waived. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any further amendment thereto, 12 to final passage without intervening motion except: (1) 90 minutes of debate equally divided and controlled by the 14 15 chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on the Judiciary; and (2) one motion to recommit with or 16 without instructions. 17 18 SEC. 2. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be 19 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 312) to 20 reaffirm the Mashpee Wampanoag Tribe reservation, and 21 for other purposes. - 14 and Affordable Care Act to provide for Federal Exchange
- 15 outreach and educational activities. The first reading of
- 16 the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order against
- 17 consideration of the bill are waived. General debate shall
- 18 be confined to the bill and amendments specified in this
- 19 section and shall not exceed 90 minutes, with 60 minutes
- 20 equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking
- 21 minority member of the Committee on Energy and Com-
- 22 merce and 30 minutes equally divided and controlled by
- 23 the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee
- 24 on Education and Labor. After general debate the bill
- 25 shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute

3	Commerce now printed in the bill, an amendment in the
4	nature of a substitute consisting of the text of Rules Com-
5	mittee Print 116-14 shall be considered as adopted in the
6	House and in the Committee of the Whole. The bill, as
7	amended, shall be considered as the original bill for the
8	purpose of further amendment under the five-minute rule
9	and shall be considered as read. All points of order against
10	provisions in the bill, as amended, are waived. No further
11	amendment to the bill, as amended, shall be in order ex-
12	cept those printed in the report of the Committee on Rules
13	accompanying this resolution. Each such further amend-
14	ment may be offered only in the order printed in the re-
15	port, may be offered only by a Member designated in the
16	report, shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for
17	the time specified in the report equally divided and con-
18	trolled by the proponent and an opponent, shall not be
19	subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to a de-
20	mand for division of the question in the House or in the
21	Committee of the Whole. All points of order against such
