Mr. MCGOVERN, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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# RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of Senate amendment to the bill (H.R. 2471) to measure the progress of post-disaster recovery and efforts to address corruption, governance, rule of law, and media freedoms in Haiti; providing for consideration of the joint resolution (H.J. Res. 75) making further continuing appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, and for other purposes;

providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 6968) to prohibit the importation of energy products of the Russian Federation, and for other purposes; and providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 7007) making emergency supplemental appropriations for coronavirus response and relief for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it  
2 shall be in order to take from the Speaker's table the bill  
3 (H.R. 2471) to measure the progress of post-disaster re-  
4 covery and efforts to address corruption, governance, rule  
5 of law, and media freedoms in Haiti, with the Senate  
6 amendment thereto, and to consider in the House, without  
7 intervention of any point of order, a motion offered by the  
8 chair of the Committee on Appropriations or her designee  
9 that the House concur in the Senate amendment with an  
10 amendment consisting of the text of Rules Committee  
11 Print 117-35 modified by the amendment printed in the  
12 report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this reso-  
13 lution. The Senate amendment and the motion shall be  
14 considered as read. The motion shall be debatable for one  
15 hour equally divided and controlled by the chair and rank-  
16 ing minority member of the Committee on Appropriations  
17 or their respective designees. The previous question shall  
18 be considered as ordered on the motion to its adoption  
19 without intervening motion. The question of adoption of  
20 the motion shall be divided for a separate vote on all of

1 the matter proposed to be inserted by the amendment of  
2 the House other than divisions B, C, F, X, and Z, and  
3 titles 2 and 3 of division N. The two portions of the di-  
4 vided question shall be considered in the order specified  
5 by the Chair. If either portion of the divided question fails  
6 of adoption, then the House shall be considered to have  
7 made no disposition of the Senate amendment.

8       SEC. 2. The chair of the Committee on Appropria-  
9 tions and the chair of the Permanent Select Committee  
10 on Intelligence may insert in the Congressional Record not  
11 later than March 11, 2022, such material as they may  
12 deem explanatory of the Senate amendment and the mo-  
13 tion specified in the first section of this resolution.

14       SEC. 3. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
15 in order to consider in the House the joint resolution (H.J.  
16 Res. 75) making further continuing appropriations for the  
17 fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, and for other pur-  
18 poses. All points of order against consideration of the joint  
19 resolution are waived. The joint resolution shall be consid-  
20 ered as read. All points of order against provisions in the  
21 joint resolution are waived. The previous question shall be  
22 considered as ordered on the joint resolution and on any  
23 amendment thereto to final passage without intervening  
24 motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and  
25 controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of

1 the Committee on Appropriations or their respective des-  
2 ignees; and (2) one motion to recommit.

3 SEC. 4. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
4 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 6968)  
5 to prohibit the importation of energy products of the Rus-  
6 sian Federation, and for other purposes. All points of  
7 order against consideration of the bill are waived. The bill  
8 shall be considered as read. All points of order against  
9 provisions in the bill are waived. The previous question  
10 shall be considered as ordered on the bill and on any  
11 amendment thereto to final passage without intervening  
12 motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and  
13 controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of  
14 the Committee on Ways and Means or their respective des-  
15 ignees; and (2) one motion to recommit.

16 SEC. 5. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
17 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 7007)  
18 making emergency supplemental appropriations for  
19 coronavirus response and relief for the fiscal year ending  
20 September 30, 2022, and for other purposes. All points  
21 of order against consideration of the bill are waived. The  
22 bill shall be considered as read. All points of order against  
23 provisions in the bill are waived. The previous question  
24 shall be considered as ordered on the bill and on any  
25 amendment thereto to final passage without intervening

1 motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and  
2 controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of  
3 the Committee on Appropriations or their respective des-  
4 ignees; and (2) one motion to recommit.
