
PROVIDING FOR CONSIDERATION OF THE BILL (H.R. 160) TO AMEND THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986 TO REPEAL THE EXCISE TAX ON MEDICAL DEVICES, AND PROVIDING FOR CONSIDERATION OF THE BILL (H.R. 1190) TO REPEAL THE PROVISIONS OF THE PATIENT PROTECTION AND AFFORDABLE CARE ACT PROVIDING FOR THE INDEPENDENT PAYMENT ADVISORY BOARD

REPORT

The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution____, by a 7 to 3 vote, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF THE RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 160, the Protect Medical Innovation Act of 2015, under a closed rule. The resolution provides one hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on Ways and Means. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the bill. The resolution provides that the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee on Ways and Means now printed in the bill, modified by the amendment printed in part A of this report, shall be considered as adopted and the bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against provisions in the bill, as amended. The resolution provides one motion to recommit with or without instructions.

Section 2 of the resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 1190, the Protecting Seniors' Access to Medicare Act of 2015, under a closed rule. The resolution provides one hour of debate equally divided among and controlled by the chairs and ranking minority members of the Committee on Ways and Means and the Committee on Energy and Commerce. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the bill. The

resolution provides that the amendment printed in part B of this report shall be considered as adopted and the bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against provisions in the bill, as amended. The resolution provides one motion to recommit with or without instructions.

EXPLANATION OF WAIVERS

The waiver of all points of order against consideration of H.R. 160 includes a waivers of the following:

- Section 306 of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974, which prohibits consideration of legislation within the jurisdiction of the Committee on the Budget unless referred to or reported by the Budget Committee; and
- Section 311 of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974, which prohibits consideration of legislation that would cause revenues to be less than the level of total revenues for the first fiscal year or for the total of that first fiscal year and the ensuing fiscal years for which allocations are provided.

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 1190, AS REPORTED
OFFERED BY MR. PITTS OF PENNSYLVANIA**

Add at the end the following new section:

1 **SEC. 3. RESCINDING FUNDING AMOUNTS FOR PREVENTION**
2 **AND PUBLIC HEALTH FUND.**

3 Section 4002(b) of the Patient Protection and Af-
4 fordable Care Act (42 U.S.C. 300u-11(b)) is amended—

5 (1) in paragraph (2), by striking “2017” and
6 inserting “2016”;

7 (2) in paragraph (5)—

8 (A) by striking “2022” and inserting
9 “2026”; and

10 (B) by redesignating such paragraph as
11 paragraph (7); and

12 (3) by striking paragraphs (3) and (4) and in-
13 serting the following:

14 “(3) for fiscal year 2017, \$390,000,000;

15 “(4) for each of fiscal years 2018 and 2019,
16 \$487,000,000;

17 “(5) for each of fiscal years 2020 and 2021,
18 \$585,000,000;

1 “(6) for each of fiscal years 2022 through
2 2025, \$780,000,000; and”.
