RESOLUTION

Approving certain regulations to implement provisions of the Congressional Accountability Act of 1995 relating to labor-management relations with respect to employees of the House of Representatives covered under section 220(e) of the Act, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved,*

2 **SECTION 1. APPROVAL OF REGULATIONS.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The regulations described in sub-
4 section (b) are hereby approved, insofar as such regula-
5 tions apply to covered employees of the House of Rep-
6 resentatives under the Congressional Accountability Act of

1 1995 and to the extent such regulations are consistent
2 with the provisions of such Act.

3 (b) REGULATIONS APPROVED.—The regulations de-
4 scribed in this subsection are the regulations issued by the
5 Office of Compliance on August 19, 1996, under section
6 220(e) of the Congressional Accountability Act of 1995
7 to implement section 220 of such Act (relating to the ap-
8 plication of chapter 71 of title 5, United States Code),
9 as published in the Congressional Record on September
10 4, 1996 (Volume 142, daily edition), beginning on page
11 H10019, and stated as follows:

12 **“§ 2472 Specific regulations regarding certain offices**
13 **of Congress**

14 **“§ 2472.1 Purpose and Scope**

15 “The regulations contained in this section implement
16 the provisions of chapter 71 as applied by section 220 of
17 the CAA to covered employees in the following employing
18 offices:

19 “(A) the personal office of any member of the
20 House of Representatives or of any Senator;

21 “(B) a standing select, special, permanent, tem-
22 porary, or other committee of the Senate or House
23 of Representatives, or a joint committee of Congress;

24 “(C) the Office of the Vice President (as Presi-
25 dent of the Senate), the office of the President pro

1 tempore of the Senate, the Office of the Majority
2 Leader of the Senate, the Office of the Minority
3 Leader of the Senate, the Office of the Majority
4 Whip of the Senate, the Office of the Minority Whip
5 of the Senate, the Conference of the Majority of the
6 Senate, the Conference of the Minority of the Sen-
7 ate, the Office of the Secretary of the Conference of
8 the Majority of the Senate, the Office of the Sec-
9 retary of the Conference of the Minority of the Sen-
10 ate, the Office of the Secretary for the Majority of
11 the Senate, the Office of the Secretary for the Mi-
12 nority of the Senate, the Majority Policy Committee
13 of the Senate, the Minority Policy Committee of the
14 Senate, and the following offices within the Office of
15 the Secretary of the Senate: Offices of the Parlia-
16 mentarian, Bill Clerk, Legislative Clerk, Journal
17 Clerk, Executive Clerk, Enrolling Clerk, Official Re-
18 porters of Debate, Daily Digest, Printing Services,
19 Captioning Services, and Senate Chief Counsel for
20 Employment;

21 “(D) the Office of the Speaker of the House of
22 Representatives, the Office of the Majority Leader of
23 the House of Representatives, the Office of the Mi-
24 nority Leader of the House of Representatives, the
25 Offices of the Chief Deputy Majority Whips, the Of-

1 fices of the Chief Deputy Minority Whips, and the
2 following offices within the Office of the Clerk of the
3 House of Representatives: Offices of Legislative Op-
4 erations, Official Reporters of Debate, Official Re-
5 porters to Committees, Printing Services, and Legis-
6 lative Information;

7 “(E) the Office of the Legislative Counsel of
8 the Senate, the Office of the Senate Legal Counsel,
9 the Office of the Legislative Counsel of the House
10 of Representatives, the Office of the General Counsel
11 of the House of Representatives, the Office of the
12 Parliamentarian of the House of Representatives,
13 and the Office of the Law Revision Counsel;

14 “(F) the offices of any caucus or party organi-
15 zation;

16 “(G) the Congressional Budget Office, the Of-
17 fice of Technology Assessment, and the Office of
18 Compliance; and

19 “(H) the Executive Office of the Secretary of
20 the Senate, the Office of Senate Security, the Senate
21 Disbursing Office, the Administrative Office of the
22 Sergeant at Arms of the Senate, the Office of the
23 Majority Whip of the House of Representatives, the
24 Office of the Minority Whip of the House of Rep-
25 resentatives, the Office of House Employment Coun-

1 sel, the Immediate Office of the Clerk of the House
2 of Representatives, the Immediate Office of the
3 Chief Administrative Officer of the House of Rep-
4 resentatives, the Office of Legislative Computer Sys-
5 tems of the House of Representatives, the Office of
6 Finance of the House of Representatives and the
7 Immediate Office of the Sergeant at Arms of the
8 House of Representatives.

9 **“§ 2472.2 Application of Chapter 71**

10 “(a) The requirements and exemptions of chapter 71
11 of title 5, United States Code, as made applicable by sec-
12 tion 220 of the CAA, shall apply to covered employees who
13 are employed in the offices listed in section H2472.1 in
14 the same manner and to the same extent as those require-
15 ments and exemptions are applied to other covered em-
16 ployees.

17 “(b) The regulations of the Office, as set forth at sec-
18 tion 2420–29 and 2470–71, shall apply to the employing
19 offices listed in section 2472.1, covered employees who are
20 employed in those offices, and representatives of those em-
21 ployees.”.
